

Module 2 Textbooks

* *Optional: Logos Bible Software Scholars' Library*

This searchable software can replace the texts marked by an asterisk. If you have access to a compatible computer, you can use this software to read from the marked texts or their equivalent in an electronic format. This software also contains hundreds of titles that could be useful as you do research for papers on biblical studies topics.

For assignments in the marked texts, use the Logos search feature to locate articles in the library on the assigned topics.

For Hebrew lessons, use the Interlinear and English-Hebrew Concordance in Logos. We highly recommend the Logos system. Logos also contains reference tools that can be used for your Greek lessons. The Greek reference works that Logos can replace are marked by an asterisk.

(Please note that while the Logos software replaces all items that are marked with a (*) this does not indicate that all of these items are found on Logos exactly. The (*) indicates only that a functional equivalent of the book marked with a (*) can be found on Logos. Therefore, the books marked with a (*) do not need to be purchased in addition to Logos because the information found on Logos suffices to fulfill the requirements of your assignments. Therefore, if your assignment has you read the entry for "Jesus" in the *Holman Bible Handbook*, then you may simply look up "Jesus" in the Logos software to find the information needed.)
